A reclamation permit is required to lawfully operate a nonmetallic mine that meets the requirements under Chapter 4.1007 of the Rock County Code of Ordinances. **There are three steps to obtaining a permit.** **First**, contact the appropriate municipal zoning authority regarding zoning approval to begin mining. This permit application is in regard to reclamation and is not authorization to begin mining operations. **Second**, supply the information requested below using this form. Attach documentation from the municipal zoning authority to this form. **Third**, submit a reclamation plan and proof of financial assurance and pay a plan review fee. The amount of the plan review fee is based on the number of acres of the proposed mine. Personally identifiable information provided on this form will be used solely for program administration and enforcement. Additional information may be attached. Itemized instructions are on the back. Please complete all information requested. Please print or type.

APPLICANT / SITE INFORMATION

1. **Applicant/Operator** - If the applicant/operator conducts business as a corporation or partnership, please provide that name and business address, not that of the individual signing the application. The applicant is assumed to be acting with the knowledge of the owner in this application. An e-mail address is optional, used only to communicate in a timely manner with the applicant.
2. **Property Owner/Lessor** - If there is more than one owner/lessor, all names and information must be provided. Separate sheets may be attached for this purpose. If the applicant/operator is not the same as the property owner/lessor, assurances may be required to insure the property owner agrees with the reclamation plan. Again, the e-mail address is optional.
3. **Property Location** - Each permitted site should have a unique street address. If the site does not currently have a street address, one may be obtained. A mining site may be located on two or more parcels; include all parcel numbers to be covered by one permit. An operator of separate, non-contiguous mining sites located on adjacent parcels may apply for one permit and plan.
4. **Site Information** - A general description of the aggregate mined (sand, gravel, limestone, clay, etc.) is sufficient. The planned acreage should be the amount of land disturbed by mining operations that will be reclaimed as described in the reclamation plan. If this site qualifies as a Local Transportation-Related mine under Section 4.1015 (4) of the Rock County Code of Ordinances, please attach a copy of the contract. Local Transportation-Related mines qualify for an “automatic” permit, with no reclamation plan, financial assurance, or public hearing, and a lower annual fee.
5. **Zoning Information** - The Municipal Zoning Authority is the local unit of government with land use zoning authority. This may be a city, village, or town. An approved reclamation plan and permit from the Land Conservation Department is not authorization to begin mining.
6. **Permit Request** - A signature is required by someone authorized to apply for this permit on behalf of the applicant.
