SUPPORTING THE DESIGNATION OF THE MADISON REGION ECONOMIC PARTNERSHIP AS AN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Since mid-2006 stakeholders, from throughout the eight county region anchored by the Madison MSA, have been working through a collaborative economic development framework. While the names of this framework have shifted over the years, its focus on creating a regional economic development blueprint has remained constant. Today, this framework is known as the Madison Region Economic Partnership (MadREP).

In early 2011, the predecessor of MadREP successfully applied for funding from the U.S. Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration (EDA) to develop a regional Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). A CEDS, which is intended to bring together the public and private sectors in the creation of an economic development roadmap to diversify and strengthen the regional economy, provides a pathway for a regional organization to access federal funding that support the activities of its designated service territory – known as an Economic Development District (EDD).

During 2011-2013, stakeholders from Rock County participated with their MadREP counterparts, at different stages and related capacities, to develop and complete an approved EDA regional CEDS. Referred to as *Advance Now: Madison Region's Strategy for Economic Growth*, this CEDS is designed to serve as a consensus blueprint for economic development efforts throughout MadREP's EDD.

To become a recognized EDD, MadREP is required to submit their CEDS and other supporting documentation. One important piece of this documentation includes receiving support (which is intentionally broadly defined) from the counties that participated in the CEDS process. This Resolution of Support provides that official documentation.
