### "Healthful Hints" Monthly Health News Column

At the Pool, Safety is C.O.O.L.!

This year, nearly 300 children younger than five will drown in swimming pools and spas and more than 3,200 children that age will go to hospital emergency rooms due to submersion injuries in pools and spas, according to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC).

Remember to stay C.O.O.L. this summer when you have young children around a pool or spa.

- 1. C Constant Adult Supervision: Assign an adult to supervise children in and around the swimming pool or spa. Maintain eye-to-eye supervision with children who are swimming and remove children from the pool area for any distraction, such as a telephone call, use of the restroom, etc. Also, keep an eye out for the dangerous "too's," too much sun, too tired, too cold, too far from safety, and too much strenuous activity.
- 2. **O** Obstruct Access to Entry: Have a fence enclosure barrier that isolates your pool and spa from the home, play areas, front and side yards, and the neighbor's yard. Make sure that all gates are self-closing and self-latching.
- 3. **O** Over-Confidence Awareness: Floaties or other inflatable flotation devices are not life jackets and should never be substituted for adult supervision. Children that have had swim lessons can still drown. *Never assume a drowning incident couldn't happen to you or your family.*
- 4. L-Learn to Be Prepared: Purchase or compile a first-aid kit for at home use. Have rescue equipment near the pool. Enroll children 3 years of age and older in swimming lessons. Teach children to swim only with adult supervision. Stay knowledgeable of the water environment and potential hazards like threatening weather.

Don't own a pool? About two-thirds of the drowning deaths that happen at home, not including pools, occur in bathtubs. Some of these bathtub drowning deaths happened when children were in bath seats or rings. The CPSC offers these safety tips for all families and caregivers to help prevent childhood drowning deaths in and around the home.

- 1. **Never** leave a baby alone in a bathtub even for a second. Always keep your baby within arm's reach.
- 2. **Never** leave young children alone or with young siblings in a bathtub even if you are using a bath seat or ring. Children can drown quickly and silently.

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- 3. Keep the toilet lid down, and keep young children out of the bathroom when unsupervised. Toilets are often an overlooked hazard in the home. The typical scenario involves a child under 3 years old falling headfirst into the toilet.
- 4. Be sure all containers that contain liquids are emptied immediately after use. Do not leave empty containers in yards or around the house where they may accumulate water and attract young children.
- 5. Learn CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) it can be a lifesaver!

Using as many of these proven water safety tips as you can is the best way to ensure a safe and fun experience, because you never know which one might save a child's life – until it does. Remember to be C.O.O.L. this summer and stay safe at your backyard pool!
