We the undersigned Supervisors of the town of Flymouth, Rock County having by and order bearing date of November 22nd 1864, upon due application for that purpose laid a highway as follows: Commencing on the South line of Section four West of and contiguous to the West line of the Beloit and Madison rail road running; thence North West on the West side of said rail road to the quarter line of said section; thence west on the said quarter line to the West line of said section; thence North to the public highway. Certain owners of land through which said highway is laid out to wit: Patrick Conlin King and one acre in the South West corner of the west half of the North West quarter of Section No. 4 of said town of Plymouth, owner not known. Not haveing released all claims to damage sustained by reason of laying out and opening said highway and not being able to agree with them as to the amount of such damages having applied to them for that purpose and endeavored to make such agreement we did proceed and assess the damages which such owners would sustain by reason of the laying out such highway through their land. To King on the East half of the South West quarter of Section four, we have awarded the sum of twenty dollars. To King on the West half of South West quarter of the section aforesaid the sum of eight dollars. To Patrick Conlin on the South end of the West half of the North West quarter of the Section aforesaid the sum of ten dollars and to the owner of the one acre on the south west corner of West half North west quarter of said Section four the sum of ten dollars.
