whereas upon the application of six freeholders residing in said town of Porter for the laying out of a highway herein after described, we the undersigned Supervisors of said town aid on the 25th day of January A.D. 1868 meet at the house of Henry Fratt, in said town for the purpose of then and there deciding upon such application, it being the time and place fixed by us for that purpose; did proceed to examine personally such highway and having then and there heard such reasons as were offered for and against laying out the same, did then and there decide upon such application and determine to lay out such highway as herein after described. Having as required by law, first made out a notice and fixed therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application and the applicant for such highway having five days previous to our said meeting, caused such notice to be duly given to all the occupants of the ... lands through which said highway passes, and such notice having, also been posted up in three public places in said town, ten days before the time of our said meeting. It is ordered and determined and we do hereby order and determine that a highway be and the same is hereby laid out as follows to wit: whereof an accurate survey has been made, which is as follows:

Beginning at the S.w. Corner of Section 3 T. 4 N.R.ll E.; thence North on the Section line 10 chains to a point near Baafish River; thence North 34% Bast 4,62 chains to stake on point of dry land; thence North 25° East 2.40 chains to stake; thence North 2½%.2.36 chains to stake; thence North 53½% West 5.85 chains to Section line running North on Section line 12.94 chains to the foot of a hill; thence N. 44½% East 3.04 chains to stake; thence North 63° East 3.79 chains to the East & West; line on Section 3; thence East on the ½ line 14.53 chains to S.E. corner of S.W.½ of North W.½ of Section 3; thence North on line of eighties 39.45 chains to the North line of said Section 3, the same being the County line and the whole length of said road is one mile 18 chains and 98 links. Course given according to the true meridian variation of needle 8° The line of said Survey to be the center of said highway and the same is established four rods in width.
