## Amending the Intergovernmental Agreement with Dane County for Medical Examiner Services

In 2015, Rock County replaced the elected coroner's system with an appointed medical examiner system to operate a more efficient, professional manner that would ensure the highest quality of services to the residents of Rock County. Beginning in late 2014, Rock County has contracted with Dane County via an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) to provide professional and administrative services. The current IGA covers the period from 2021 to 2025 which was approved at the December 17, 2020 County Board meeting.

Dane County has been having trouble remaining competitive with forensic pathologist staff compensation. To reflect market conditions, Dane County has adjusted the compensation for the staff forensic pathologists resulting in the need to amend the IGA by the following amounts for the remainder of the multi-year contract:

2022 \$11,553.20 2023 \$11,619.53 2024 \$8,544.22 2025 \$8,783.19

As a result, the 2022 contract cost would increase from \$350,372.07 to \$361,925.27 or 3.3%.

This resolution would amend the IGA to reflect the increased costs which are listed in Schedule A of the agreement and would be incorporated into future Medical Examiner budgets.

- 2. The rear yard setback for all structures shall be 25 feet.
- 3. The front yard setback for all structures shall be 25 feet.

### **Executive Summary**

In a number of subdivisions platted well prior to the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance (1971) there are lots that are considered substandard, i.e don't meet current standards for new lots. Those lots are generally considered buildable as long as all other standards are met per Ordinance. Many of these lots are service by public sewer, especially in the vicinity of Lake Koshkonong. However, there are lots that are served by private onsite septic systems. By ordinance, these lots require a 50-foot road setback, just as a larger lot in a more rural area would. This is to primarily maintain a greater distance from the road for safety purposes because speed limits are higher than would normally be in a subdivision setting.

Unless prohibited for some other reasons (such as state minimum standards), if the same provision in an ordinance is regularly generating variance applications, the correct thing to do is to amend the ordinance. That is the case for these smaller lots with a required 50 foot front yard setback. A vast majority of variance requests heard by the Board of Adjustment are for a reduction of the front yard setback, often to build a detached garage. Either the existing house is already too close to the road to allow space of the garage or the lot is simply too small to make the setback functional. These variances are typically approved provided the applicant proves their case and the size of the accessory structure is reasonable (roughly a two-car garage).

The proposed ordinance amendment reduces the required setback to 25 feet as long as certain conditions are met, most importantly safety from the public road and documenting an approvable location for replacement private onsite sanitary system. A 25-foot front yard setback is consistent with the requirement for all sewered lots.

### **Employment Services Agreement**

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the County of Rock (hereinafter referred to as "EMPLOYER") and Paul Crawford (hereinafter, "EMPLOYEE"),

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS EMPLOYER whose address is c/o County Administrator, 51 South Main Street, Janesville, WI 53545, desires to obtain the services of Paul Crawford to serve as Veteran Service Officer,

WHEREAS EMPLOYEE, whose current address is able and willing to serve as Veteran Service Officer;

is

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and the mutual covenants of the parties hereinafter set forth, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by each party for itself, EMPLOYER and EMPLOYEE do agree as follows:

- 1. CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT; GENERAL PROVISIONS. Employment of EMPLOYEE is subject to the general supervision and shall be conducted pursuant to the orders, advice and direction of the County Administrator and be governed by the terms and conditions of Chapter 18 of the Rock County Ordinance, except as to the terms and conditions that are herein modified. Employment is further subject to EMPLOYEE's compliance with and implementation of policies established from time to time by EMPLOYER in the exercise of its lawful authority. EMPLOYEE shall perform such other duties as are customarily performed by one holding the same or similar positions in other governmental organizations or businesses which provide similar services. EMPLOYER reserves to the County Administrator the right to require EMPLOYEE to render such other and unrelated services and duties as may be assigned from time to time by the County Administrator.
- 2. DUTIES OF EMPLOYEE; GENERAL PROVISIONS. EMPLOYEE agrees to perform lawfully, faithfully, industriously, competently, dutifully and to the best of EMPLOYEE's ability, all of the duties that may be required of EMPLOYEE pursuant to the express or implied terms of this agreement, to the level of satisfaction that the County Administrator may reasonably require.
- 3. DUTIES OF EMPLOYEE; JOB DESCRIPTION. The duties of EMPLOYEE shall include but not be limited to those expressly stated or implied in the job description for the position, as may be revised from time to time by EMPLOYER as circumstances change, and as set forth in applicable state statutes. This paragraph is further subject to the right of assignment reserved to the County Administrator, as set forth in paragraph 1 hereof.
- 4. DUTIES OF EMPLOYEE; OFFICIAL ACTS OF COUNTY BOARD. The duties of EMPLOYEE shall also include but not be limited to those expressly stated or implied in the ordinances, resolutions or motions of EMPLOYER's county board or any of its committees acting within the scope of their lawful authority.
- 5. DUTIES OF EMPLOYEE; DIRECTIVES OF COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR. The duties of EMPLOYEE shall also include but not be limited to those expressly stated or implied in orders, directives, or rules of the County Administrator.

- 6. TERM OF AGREEMENT. The term of this agreement shall be a period of 1 year, commencing at 8:00 a.m., Monday, September 13, 2021, and expiring as of Midnight, September 12, 2022, unless earlier terminated under other provisions of this agreement or by operation of law.
- 7. NONRENEWAL OF AGREEMENT. At its expiration this agreement shall not be considered renewed unless extended in writing by mutual agreement of the parties. If it is the County Administrator's intention not to renew this agreement, the County Administrator will attempt to give EMPLOYEE three (3) months advance written notice of the intent not to renew this agreement, provided, however, that failure to give such notice shall create no obligation on EMPLOYER to continue EMPLOYEE's employment beyond the expiration date of this agreement. The County Administrator may extend EMPLOYEE's employment on a month-to-month basis for a period not to exceed 3 months, pending renewal of this agreement.
- 8. EMPLOYEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES; ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS. EMPLOYEE shall at all times observe and comply with all ethical obligations imposed or required by constitution, statute, ordinance or other provision of law and shall at all times conduct EMPLOYEE's personal affairs in such a manner as to avoid a conflict of interest or appearance of conflict and in accordance with the duties and responsibilities of public officials. During normal work hours EMPLOYEE shall at all times devote all of EMPLOYEE's time, attention, knowledge and skills solely to the interests of the EMPLOYER, and EMPLOYEE shall never use EMPLOYEE's position or confidential information gained in such work position for EMPLOYEE's personal gain, either directly or indirectly.
- 9. EMPLOYEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES; CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. EMPLOYEE shall not at any time or in any manner, either during the term of this agreement or thereafter, either directly or indirectly divulge, disclose or communicate to any person any confidential information gained in the performance of EMPLOYEE's duties except as otherwise required or compelled by law.
- 10. EMPLOYEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES; EXCLUSIVE EMPLOYMENT. EMPLOYEE agrees to remain in the exclusive employ of EMPLOYER throughout the term of this agreement. The term "exclusive employ" shall not be construed to prohibit occasional teaching, writing or consulting which is performed on EMPLOYEE's time off and which does not affect EMPLOYEE's job performance, subject to prior approval of the County Administrator.
- 11. HOURS OF WORK. The usual and customary hours of business of EMPLOYER are from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, however, as a managerial employee, EMPLOYEE shall have as a condition of employment a job to perform and shall work such hours as are necessary to accomplish the tasks assigned to EMPLOYEE.
- 12. EVALUATION AND GOALS. At least annually, the County Administrator or his or her designee shall meet with EMPLOYEE to discuss job performance and to define goals and objectives for both EMPLOYEE and EMPLOYER.
- 13. EMPLOYEE'S DUTIES; LIMITED CONTRACTING AUTHORITY. EMPLOYEE shall not have the right to make contracts or commitments for or on behalf of EMPLOYER except as expressly authorized in advance by statute, ordinance, or express written consent of EMPLOYER.
- 14. COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEE; BASE COMPENSATION. EMPLOYER shall pay EMPLOYEE, and EMPLOYEE shall accept from EMPLOYER in payment for EMPLOYEE's services, direct compensation at a rate provided for in the Unilateral Pay Plan for the position occupied by the EMPLOYEE.
- 15. COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEE; COMPENSATION FOR EXPENSES. EMPLOYER shall reimburse EMPLOYEE for all necessary expenses incurred in the service of EMPLOYER, in accordance with Rock County ordinances and regulations on reimbursement of expenses, provided that EMPLOYEE complies with all applicable provisions of law and Rock County ordinances and procedures prior to incurring or claiming reimbursement for such expenses. It is expressly

understood that prior approval of the County Administrator is required for attendance at conferences held outside of Wisconsin and that attendance is further subject to the rules, regulations and ordinances applicable to managerial employees employed by the EMPLOYER.

- 16. COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEE; FRINGE BENEFITS. Except as otherwise set forth in this agreement, and in addition to the monetary compensation set forth above EMPLOYEE shall receive fringe benefits as are enumerated from time to time in resolutions and general ordinances of EMPLOYER, on the same terms as these are made available to non-represented managerial and professional employees of EMPLOYER.
- 17. VACATION. EMPLOYEE shall receive fifteen (15) days of vacation annually on anniversary date, April 10. Carry-over of unused vacation shall be allowed under such conditions as are contained in the Rock County Personnel Policy.
- 18. COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEE; TREATMENT OF DIRECT COMPENSATION FOR TAX PURPOSES. The direct financial compensation paid EMPLOYEE under this Agreement shall be treated as wages for federal and state tax purposes and for purposes of allowing EMPLOYEE to participate in the Wisconsin retirement system. EMPLOYEE recognizes that EMPLOYER will withhold taxes, Social Security and the like from direct compensation. EMPLOYEE shall be allowed to participate in EMPLOYER's deferred compensation program(s) and Section 125 Flexible Spending Account, at EMPLOYEE's option and to the extent permitted by law.
- 19. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT BY EMPLOYEE; NOTICE REQUIRED FOR RESIGNATION. This agreement may be terminated by EMPLOYEE on 30-days' written notice to the County Administrator. Any such notice, once accepted by the County Administrator, may not be withdrawn or rescinded. The fact that the County Administrator has asked EMPLOYEE for EMPLOYEE's resignation shall not invalidate any such resignation once tendered to, and accepted by, the County Administrator. Accrued but unused vacation and holiday time shall be paid out to EMPLOYEE upon resignation, provided sufficient notice as required above is received.
- 20. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT BY EMPLOYER; EMPLOYER'S RIGHT TO TERMINATE AT WILL. This agreement may be terminated, or any obligation of EMPLOYER under this agreement may be suspended, by the County Administrator at any time during its term, in the sole discretion of the County Administrator. EMPLOYEE shall be deemed to be an at-will employee of EMPLOYER who shall have no remedy or recourse in the event of disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.
- 21. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT BY EMPLOYER; DISCIPLINARY ACTION; PROCEDURE FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION. All disciplinary action shall originate from the County Administrator and be accomplished by the County Administrator.
- 22. EMPLOYER TO INDEMNIFY AND DEFEND EMPLOYEE FOR OFFICIAL ACTS. EMPLOYER shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless EMPLOYEE, in accordance with the requirements of s. 895.46, Wis. Stats. EMPLOYER reserves the right to compromise or settle any such litigation in any fashion deemed advantageous to EMPLOYER, regardless of whether EMPLOYEE consents thereto.
- 23. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT; NO ASSIGNMENT. EMPLOYEE shall not assign or transfer any interest or obligation in this Agreement, whether by assignment or novation. It is expressly understood EMPLOYER will not consent to any assignment of EMPLOYEE's duties and obligations.
- 24. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT; SEVERABILITY. All parts of this agreement are severable from all other parts and invalidity of any part shall not operate to invalidate any other part.

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- 25. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT; WISCONSIN LAW CONTROLS. It is expressly understood and agreed that in the event of any dispute between the parties, arising under this agreement, Wisconsin law shall control to the extent that it is not superseded by any applicable federal law.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### URBAN YOUTH PRIMARY PREVENTION GRANT FUNDING

Rock County has received supplemental grant funding to provide Primary Prevention Services to Urban Youth. These additional funds will be used to provide the following:

- Prevention kits to school districts and youth serving agencies. The kits will provide a variety of educational materials related to the myths and facts related to the impact of alcohol, marijuana, vaping, and prescription drug misuse.
- Educational information regarding the impact of substance misuse on billboards and radio public announcements.
- Early intervention and educational programs including community trainings and collaborations through evidence based prevention programs. Catch My Breath evidence based model could be widely taught to provide early intervention regarding vaping.
- Prevention signage regarding substance use, vaping and tobacco use in city and county parks.
- A media campaign in collaboration with the prevention kits will provide consistent messaging and education in all areas of the community serving youth.

The perception of harm in Rock County is lower than the state average and the national average. Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance (YRBS) data show 25.8% of Rock County parents have a low perception of harm regarding binge drinking. Students whose parents feel it is not wrong to excessively drink alcohol were about 2.5 times more likely to have engaged in binge drinking at least once in the past 30 days. YRBS data in Rock County show 10.8% of youth report have had a drink in the last 30 days. Providing facts about first use and education regarding how to have conversations with families will increase perception of harm. Research shows parental influence is the biggest deterrent for youth substance use. 2019 data collected through the Department of Health Services shows binge drinking in Rock County is 18.7% and 64% of adults report binge drinking in the last month. Perception of harm regarding alcohol use is predominately lower in Rock County and Wisconsin as a whole than in other areas of the country. Through education and information dissemination that perception of harm can be increased.

Providing education through evidenced based programs, will prevent drug abuse, improve quality of life, academic performance and reduce referrals to school administration and law enforcement. Providing youth with activities that are substance free and coaching on refusal skills will provide the youth with tools to increase support of a drug free lifestyle and reduce risk of drug abuse.

WHEREAS, the County of Rock has applied for and received Housing and Community Development Grants from Federal and State Agencies since 1978 for housing rehabilitation, down payment, and emergency management assistance; and,

Stats, to address unsafe inhabited dwellings, the shortage of decent, safe and sanitary rental units for low and moderate income citizens and the shortage of affordable dwellings available for those seeking to purchase a home; and,

> WHEREAS, The Housing Authority consists of five members, including two County Board Supervisors, but is not a subcommittee of the County Board, receives only minimal staff support and funding in the Planning Department budget for conducting meetings, per diems and mileage, etc; and,

> WHEREAS, the HOME program, including application review, contracting, project oversite and final approval, is primarily managed by a third-party consultant and funded through administrative dollars available via the HOME Consortium funds; and,

> WHEREAS, the Housing Authority desires to explore the additional funding options available to expand the housing related resources that the Authority can offer citizens in the County (based on the authority in statutes), which can include, but is not limited to: rent/lease owned housing units, investigate living conditions, acquire, rehab and sell property, construct new dwelling units for sale or rent; and,

> WHEREAS, the Housing Authority would like a plan to be developed outlining options and a proposed path to meet the long term goals. It has been determined that a consultant with expertise on these matters would be the most cost-efficient way to generate a plan; and,

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This resolution authorizes providing funding to the Rock County Housing Authority (Authority) to hire a consultant to develop a plan intended to address the desire of Authority members to expand the housing resources that are available to county citizens.

The Authority was established in 2004 primarily to be the official administrator of HOME Consortium grant funds. It was determined at the time that the County could not administer the funds directly. The Authority, therefore, is not a subcommittee of the County Board, but does include two Board members and three citizens. Powers of the Housing Authority are authorized in 59.53(22) and 66.1201 Wisconsin Stats

Since the establishment, the resources made available by the Authority have primarily been associated with the HOME Consortium eligible projects, i.e. rental rehab, single family home rehab and down payment assistance, all of which are applicable to low to moderate income citizens. The program is currently managed by a third-party consultant funded by the administrative dollars available through the grant program.

The Authority would like to expand housing resources available in the County beyond HOME eligible projects to address other needs, such as a shortage of low income housing. There are other State and Federal funding sources available, but navigating the options to come up with the best solution to the goals of the Authority would be best done by a private consultant with expertise on these matter. The Authority has no budget and no funds available and therefore requests that the County Board authorize a one-time payment to the Authority to proceed with an RFP and ultimately hiring of a consultant to complete a plan.

#### Allocating American Rescue Plan Act Funding to Provide for Tenant Legal Aid

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has had a negative effect on some individuals and families, including through job loss, and has exacerbated the difficulties of certain low-income individuals who were already facing economic challenges; and,

WHEREAS, eviction moratoria and other measures to keep household utilities operating that were put in place during the pandemic have kept many individuals and families safely in their homes, but the eviction moratorium issued by the Centers for Disease Control will eventually not be renewed; and

WHEREAS, when this moratorium is removed, many individuals and families will have months' worth of back-rent due without the ability to pay, which will likely lead to the commencement of eviction proceedings; and,

WHEREAS, many landlords have not received rent payments while eviction moratoria have been in place, creating hardships for these business owners, who will legally be entitled to seek such past-due and future rent from tenants; and,

WHEREAS, statistics indicate that low-income and otherwise disadvantaged populations, who are more likely to face eviction, have also been less likely to have received a COVID-19 vaccine, creating a situation in which evictions may displace individuals into shared housing, shelters, or homelessness and thereby increase the likelihood of spreading COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) has provided funding that can be utilized to address housing-related emergencies created or exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, while several community agencies may have sufficient funding currently from ARPA, Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), and/or other sources for eviction and utility aid, there may be a longer term need to address these issues with ARPA funding if currently available funds run out; and

WHEREAS, a current gap in the system in Rock County is sufficient legal resources to assist those who may lack the legal background or have insufficient resources to navigate the court eviction process; and

WHEREAS, tenants, in particular, lack the resources necessary for representation in an eviction proceeding in court, putting them at a disadvantage; and

**WHEREAS**, Legal Action of Wisconsin provides free legal aid to low income people, including eviction and other housing law matters; and

WHEREAS, Everyone Cooperating to Help Others (ECHO) has expressed interest in providing an inkind donation of office space to support staff from Legal Action who can operate this program; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for a long-term strategy to provide a landlord-tenant mediation program, and to address homelessness, transitional housing, and affordable housing, all of which have been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic that will require future efforts of the County Board and that will be coming forward in subsequent resolution(s).

Frank Marsden was involved in many organizations around Rock County. He was a volunteer, an advocate, and a business owner.

He was a founding member of the Turtle Volunteer Fire Department, a Board of Trustees Member at the First Baptist Church-Beloit, and a member of the South Beloit Rescue Squad, Beloit Jaycees, Beloit Ambassadors, and the Beloit Lions Club. In 1993, Frank Marsden was recognized by the Beloit Daily News as the Volunteer of the Year.

Frank served in leadership roles with the Beloit City Council, Beloit School Board, Rock County Board of Supervisors-District 12 (Former Vice-Chair), Blackhawk Technical College Board of Directors, Alcohol Advisory and Review Board-Beloit, Stateline Area Boys and Girls Club, and the Beloit Police and Fire Commission.
