Slow-No-Wake Lifted on Beloit Section of the Rock River

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According to the US Geological Survey Gauge in Afton, the water level for the Rock River is currently 8.37 feet, which is below the 8.50 feet slow-no-wake County Ordinance requirement for the portion of the Rock River between W B R Townline Road Bridge and the Stateline. The slow-no-wake restriction is being lifted for this portion of the Rock River.

The slow-no-wake restriction from W B R Townline Road Bridge to the Indianford Dam remains in effect. County Ordinance requires a slow-no-wake speed restriction be placed on this portion of the Rock River when water levels exceed 6.50 feet in Afton.

The slow-no-wake remains in effect for the portion of the Rock River between the Indianford Dam and Lake Koshkonong. The water level for Lake Koshkonong is 9.03 feet. County Ordinance requires a slow-no-wake speed restriction be placed on the portion of the Rock River between the Indianford Dam and Lake Koshkonong when water levels exceed 8.00 feet on Lake Koshkonong.

The Sheriff's Office is providing public notice that the slow-no-wake speed restriction on the Rock River between W B R Townline Road Bridge and the Stateline is being lifted. Deputies will begin removing the slow-no-wake postings on this portion of the Rock River. The slow-no-wake status for the portion of the Rock River between W B R Townline Road Bridge and Lake Koshkonong remains in effect.
