# A Note from Natalie

Hello Rock Haven Family,

We are blessed to have Rock Haven Skilled Nursing Facility operating after 160 years. Thank you to our county leaders/board of supervisors for ensuring that we have a county facility for constituents that require skilled care. Please, for nursing home residents and their families need to review their financial options and eligibility for assistance programs to appropriately plan for the cost of care. The regulations and payment systems may vary from one person to another, so it is essential to consider the specific rules and policies for care.

"The facility must not request or require a third party to accept personal responsibility for paying the facility bill out of his or her own funds as a condition of admission, expedited admission, or continued stay in the facility. However, the facility may request and require a resident representative with legal access to the resident's funds available to pay for facility care to access and use the resident's money or other assistance to pay for care, as authorized by law. The facility may request and require this representative to sign a contract, without incurring personal liability, to provide the facility with payment from the resident's income or assets. A third-party guarantee is not the same as a third-party payor, e.g., an insurance company, and this provision does not preclude the facility from obtaining information about Medicare or Medicaid eligibility or the availability of private insurance. The prohibition against third-party guarantees applies to all residents and prospective



residents in all certified long-term care facilities, regardless of payment source (The Long-Term Care Survey, 2023, pp 204-205)."

One request I have is trust and transparency so we can work together to resolve it for you and your loved ones financially as we strive to provide you with the best quality care at Rock Haven.

# Infection Control Corner

## Did you know?

In May of 2023, a new vaccine was introduced for protection from the RSV (Respiratory syncytial virus). RSV is a virus that mostly affects children less than 1 year of age. However, this can also affect older adults. RSV is spread through coughing, sneezing, close contact with someone with RSV, and touching of objects that may contain droplets of RSV. RSV symptoms are respiratory, which include runny nose, coughing, sneezing and fever. Arexvy and Abrysvo are two new vaccines that adults aged 65 and older with certain health conditions may receive. Beyfortus is a vaccine approved for children less than 24 months. RSV occurs mostly in the fall and winter months. Healthcare providers should be aware of underlying conditions that may increase the risk of severe RSV illness, and who might be most likely to benefit from these new vaccines.


