PUBLIC HEALTH HIGHLIGHT: NARCAN® VENDING MACHINE

Free NARCAN® Vending Machine Available at Beloit Public Library

Thanks to the work of several agencies and a \$50,000 grant from the state's Opioid Settlement Funds, Beloit now has access to free NARCAN® and fentanyl test strips through a vending machine located at Beloit Public Library (BPL).

Lead by Rock County Public Health Department (RCPHD), Vivent Health, and BPL, the initiative is intended to increase access to drug overdose prevention resources.
