PUBLIC HEALTH HIGHLIGHT: COMMUNITY HEALTH ASSESSMENT

Rock County Public Health (RCPH), in partnership with the <u>Health Equity Alliance of Rock County (HEAR)</u>, is excited to announce upcoming opportunities to inform Rock County's 2024 Community Health Assessment (CHA). The CHA is used to assess Rock County's health needs and identify how and where we can improve our community's health.

Community Conversations

A Community Conversation is an event where people can gather to talk about issues they are facing in their community. Each CHA Community Conversation will ask questions and have discussions about community health. HEAR is hosting multiple in-person Community Conversations throughout the County, including Milton House Museum and the Edgerton Public Library on February 20. Those who aren't able to attend a Community Conversation are encouraged to complete an online survey available in both English and Spanish. Each response helps provide valuable insight into how Rock County residents feel about their health. This short survey takes about five minutes to complete.
